Matrix Model Training 2 Day Workshop

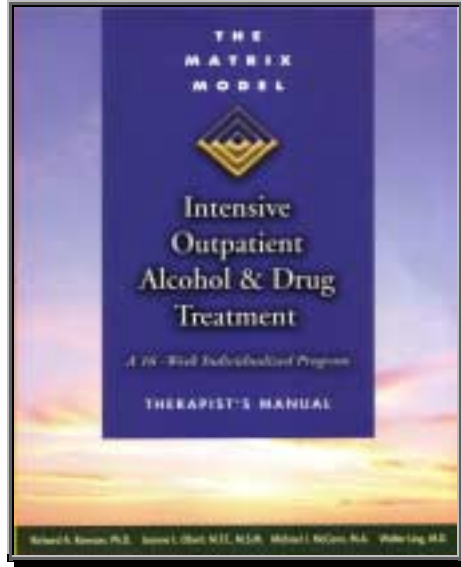
Matrix Institute on Addictions was established in 1984 to promote a greater understanding of addiction disorders and improve the quality and availability of substance treatment services.

The Matrix approach emphasizes the use of outpatient techniques. Treatments focus on lifestyle changes, training in relapse prevention, education about dependencies, and family involvement.

The two-day workshop includes a didactic overview of the Matrix Model and experiential exercises. There will be special emphasis on familiarizing the audience with the most recent findings regarding psychosocial interventions that have proven useful in treating Methamphetamine abusers.
